The Princes Czartoryski Museum
The National Museum in Krakow

about the museum




The Princes Czartoryski Museum is a part of the National Museum in Krakow. It is located in the Czartoryski Palace, which was made by joining a few buildings on the corner of the Pijarska and Świętego Jana Streets. The museum has a collection of great works of art, historical and library items collected by the Czartoryski family members. The most valuable items include paintings *Lady with an Ermine* by Leonardo da Vinci and *Landscape with the Good Samaritan* by Rembrandt Harmenszoon van Rijn.

The collection was created with the help of Izabela Czartoryska and her husband Adam Kazimierz Czartoryski. The Princess set up the first museum in Puławy over 200 years ago.



Later, her son, Adam Jerzy Czartoryski, looked after the collection in Paris, where it had been taken.



Izabela's grandchild, Władysław Czartoryski, was also a collector. About 150 years ago he decided to start the Museum of the Princes Czartoryski in Krakow. He wanted to gather the family collection and add new pieces to it. For this purpose, the city authorities of Krakow gave him the former City Arsenal, and the other buildings were bought by the Czartoryski family.




- The exhibits are placed in 26 rooms on two exhibition halls on two floors. Beautiful paintings, sculptures, fabrics, glass and ceramic dishes, knight's armour, sabres, historical documents and many more valuable objects are collected here.
- In the museum, you can also pay to borrow an audio guide. A tour of the exhibition with an audio guide takes about 1.5 – 2 hours.




entrance to the museum

The museum has a separate entrance and exit, which are located on different streets. In the picture below, the directions for entering and exiting the museum are marked with arrows.



When you enter the museum there is a lobby area with safety control gates. Behind the glass door, there is the museum security service post. Once you have passed through the security gates in the lobby, you will enter a big courtyard with a glass roof.



In the courtyard, there is a sign with direction arrows and pictures which show the way to the ticket office, cloakroom, the entrance to the exhibition, the café, restrooms, and other places. You can enter all these places from the courtyard.

ticket office and buying tickets

Remember that tickets to the Princes Czartoryski Museum are valid for a specific date and time. There is a limited number of tickets for each date.

That is why we recommend buying or booking them at an earlier time. You can enter the museum only if you have a valid ticket for a given date and time. You can buy or book tickets up to 31 days in advance. On Tuesdays, you can visit the museum for free, but you still need to book your ticket in advance. You must collect the ticket from the ticket office before you enter the exhibition. The ticket gives you access to all permanent galleries of the National Museum in Krakow except for the gallery in Sukiennice.



selected visiting rules

1. Always follow the requests and instructions of the Museum staff and the Museum security staff.
2. Rucksacks, bags, suitcases and handbags larger than 40x40x20 cm, as well as umbrellas and outerwear, should be left in a locker in the cloakroom.
3. Amateur photography and filming without additional lighting including flash and tripod is free of charge.
4. You cannot bring in and consume food and drinks. We encourage you to visit the Museum's café.

The entrance to the cloakroom is in the courtyard, on the right-hand side.

The cloakroom is self-service and there are lockers there. If you have any problems with using the cloakroom, the museum staff standing next the entrance to the cloakroom will help you.

On the cloakroom wall there are also instructions for using the lockers.

To get a locker use the touch-sensitive panel to print a locker number. Each touch on the panel triggers a sound.

Once you have printed your number, you will hear a locker opening automatically.



Be sure to close the locker after you have put your things in.

Keep the number until you collect your belongings at the end of the tour.

At the entrance, there is a place where the exhibition tickets are scanned.

Scan the ticket with the barcode placed forward (the device will make a sound).



When you scan the barcode on your ticket, the gates will open automatically (you will hear a tone).

You can enter the exhibition by going up the stairs to the first floor,

As you go up the stairs to the 1st floor, you will stop at the staircase from where you will enter the first exhibition room. If you take the elevator you will also start your tour from here.




Each room on the 1st floor has a music background. It's muted during quiet hours on first Wednesdays of each month.

After visiting the exhibition on the 1st floor, go up the stairs to the 2nd floor,



or use the elevator.

Start your visit to the exhibition on the 2nd floor by crossing the glass bridge over the courtyard. You will have to open the door to the next exhibition room by yourself.










When you exit into the courtyard, you can go to the café. We encourage you to do so!





The exit from the museum is near the café. Go through the corridor first,




