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A PROBLEMATIC CAMEO WITH A PORTRAIT OF AUGUSTUS FROM THE COLLECTION OF CONSTANTINE SCHMIDT-CIĄŻYŃSKI

The subject of the article is a fragment of a cameo from the Constantine Schmidt-Ciążyński collection housed in the National Museum in Cracow. It is a particular interesting object because of the problems with dating. It was thought that it is an ancient specimen bearing portrait of Augustus. However, close examination of the iconography, techniques of engraving as well as stone used allowed to ascertain that it is a Renaissance copy based on ancient prototype. The cameo was executed in Italy, probably in Milan in the late sixteenth century.
