Oil Painting on Paper: the Influence of the Execution Technique on the State of Preservation. A Conservation Monograph on Olga Boznańska's Oil Paintings on Cardboard Summary

Over the centuries, various supports were used for oil painting. Materials such as wood, canvas or even metal plate were most often applied; parchment or paper supports were not so frequent. Commonly believed not to be very durable, oil painting on paper support has been a rare technique: painting manuals regard it merely as a stop-gap or auxiliary solution.

This paper seeks to examine the state of preservation of objects made in oil on paper supports. It collates data found in research literature devoted to a range of collections with findings of a study of paintings by Olga Boznańska.

This paper further surveys the materials used in this technique, their mutual impacts and potential damage types arising out of those correlations.
